AGM 2011

Bidlake Memorial Trust

The Trust may mean very little to many new cyclists but the older generation may remember the annual plaque awarded to riders and others in cycling and the memorial garden on the old Great North Road near Sandy in Bedfordshire. It is now very difficult to get any mention in the press especially as the weekly cycling magazine appears to be mainly interested in sportives, cycle reviews, fitness and diets and overseas road racing: it has turned a blind eye to any home news of interest to the real cyclist. Hello! The Trust is still alive and kicking so how is it doing?

History tells us that F T Bidlake told his friends that plans were well advanced for retirement to the land west of Dartmoor in Devon from whence his ancestors hailed. Friends started a testimonial fund as he was held in very high regard but his untimely death in late 1933 resulted in it becoming a memorial fund. The funds were used to design and build the memorial garden near Sandy with the balance being used to start an annual award for a cycling achievement ranging from racing through to persons working for the betterment and advancement of cycling. The trust still has some funds but over the passing of seventy five years increasing costs and inflation have taken their toll. The memorial garden is still there maintained by a member of the trust committee with some help and the plaque is awarded each year. Although the cost of the plaque is now extremely high, it is still produced to the same design and pattern as the first one awarded in 1934 to Hubert Opperman. 76 years have passed since then to the 2009 recipient, Julia Shaw.

All branches of the sport and pastime of cycling are represented. Naturally world and national champions are to the fore taking over half of the number of plaques awarded. World champions vie with time trial champions for the most honours. Those who have served the sport are almost equal with these two categories. RRA record breakers especially those on the End to End trail are well represented, but surprisingly domestic road racing is hardly represented. Artistic and literary achievements along with cycle innovations have merited the award of the plaque from time to time. On seven occasions the trust was unable to find anyone to merit the award. The way to be worthy of a plaque appears rightly to be a champion, serve the sport unselfishly or ride from Lands End to John o'Groats.

The ladies grace the list with Beryl Burton awarded three plaques for multiple achievements from world championships, national championships at various disciplines including the rare distinction of a national record by man or woman! Marguerite Wilson was the first lady in 1939 and Eileen Sheridan, Nicole Cooke, Mandy Jones, Yvonne McGregor and Eileen Gray precede Julia Shaw.

Reg Harris, two awards for world sprint titles, and Ray Booty, first 100 miles in less than four hours, to the thinking of many cyclists head the list of men awarded the plaque. But what of the shorter distances? Names such as Peacock, Porter, Doyle, Sturgess, Boardman and Obree lead the way at the short distances but do not forget the long distance experts such as Ferris, Arnold, Crimes, Cromack, Tremaine, Carbutt, Woodburn, Longland, Wilkinson and Butler who have all won the plaque. Remember such heroes as Southall, Derbyshire, Joy, Colden, Simpson, Metcalfe, Griffiths, Cammish and Dawson, all who did rides most can only dream about. And who in the background planned, administered, directed, managed and encouraged to help put these riders at the top? Among many we should remember Stancer, Shaw, Moulton, Foster, Townsend, White, Campbell, Warner, Kitching, Webb, King and Brailsford. Not every name on the roll call of honour is mentioned above but add in the other plaque recipients and you have a list of names of all that is best in our cycling world. We should not forget Frank Patterson and John Helms whose work with pen and ink have graced the pages of our cycling magazines, and what would Patterson have made of Jeremy Isaacs of Channel 4 for the Tour de France pictures!
