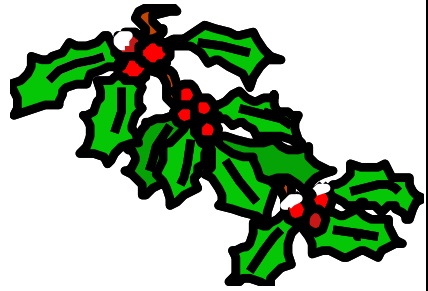

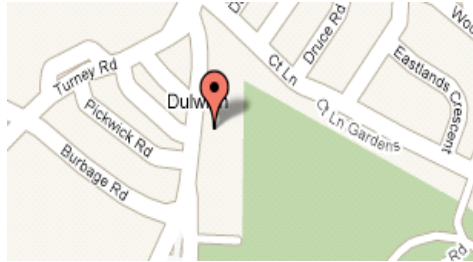

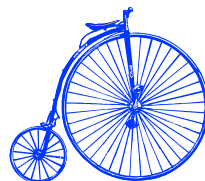
The foremost was the D. L. Harriers who had some good runners. The Boxing Club had two good men in C. Stamford and Arthur Lock who could hold his own with any lad in South London at his weigh. The Swimming Club had a number of good swimmers and I well remember our half mile in the Thames, Sims 1, J. Holden 2 and your humble 3. The Cricket Club had the longest run after the Cycling Club. I remember playing at Sharsted before the death of Mr. Faunce De Laune and the Club was still going strong when I came out here. The Football Club could also be relied upon to put up a good game, but I think I will leave Auhrey King to finish this article.

How about it, old Rib you old D. - give the boys an account of the social side, dances, concerts etc. not forgetting the good old days at Shearsted Court - "Happy Days" !! Billy Pett was not wrong when he said the Le Gry's Brothers could "burn up" any combination. Was pleased to see letter from H. Hayter, A. Saxton and J. Pound. How about an account of our journeys home from High Wycombe at Easter. Harry, was it Hamp that towed me home?

How fortunate we are away from the terrible times you are all going through. We hear all the news on the radio and I often wonder why a fiend like Hit1er is allowed to live. God help you all”
